Dr. Terrance L. Green

Terrance L. Green is an assistant professor at the University of Texas at Austin in the Department of Educational Leadership and Policy. His research focuses on the nexus of urban school reform and socially just community development with a particular focus on school and community leaders. Dr. Green's scholarship also examines issues of geography of educational opportunity for children of color from low-income backgrounds.

In addition, in 2017, Dr. Green received the Early Career Award from the American Educational Research Association (AERA)--Division A, which is given annually to an early career scholar in the first five years of her/his career and who has made outstanding research contributions to the field of educational leadership, administration & organization. In 2016, Dr. Green was the recipient of the William J. Davis award for the most outstanding article published in a volume of the Educational Administration Quarterly (the top journal in the field of educational administration and leadership).

Dr. Green's research has been published in Teachers College Record, Educational Administration Quarterly, Urban Review, International Journal of Qualitative Studies in Education, Urban Education, Education and Urban Society, Journal of School Leadership, and the Journal of Cases in Educational Leadership. In addition, his work has been featured in a variety of popular press venues such as TIME, Austin American Statesman, Dallas Morning News, Texas Tribune, Detroit Free Press, and the McAllen Monitor.

Prior to becoming a faculty member, Dr. Green was a high school science teacher.
